

#### A TRIBUTE TO REV. FR. JOSEPH KUNNAPILLY MSFS



Rev. Fr. Joseph Kunnapilly was born of Mr. Devasia and Mrs. Theresia Kunnapally on 15th December, 1945 and was baptized on 21st of December, 1945 at Kalayanthany, Kothamangalam diocese. He was confirmed on 22nd March, 1958 at Thiruvampady, Tellicherry diocese (At present Thamarassery diocese). He has five brothers and two sisters. He did his primary and secondary school studies at Sacred Heart School, Thiruvampady. He joined the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales for Brotherhood in 1969 and had his initial formation at Philip Nagar. He was admitted to Salesianum Novitiate at Visakhapatanam on 3rd May, 1971 and made his first profession on 4th May, 1972. He made his perpetual

profession on 4th May, 1977. He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Andhra University (1985). He did his Theological studies at JDV, Pune from 1994 to 1997. He was ordained a priest on 20th May, 1997 at St. Sebastian's Church, Vilakkamthode, Kerala, India.

Fr. Joseph Kunnapilly served the Church and the Congregation in various capacities. His first appointment was in SFS Printing Press, Visakhapatanam (1972 – 1982). Thereafter, he served as Bursar in Kotak School, Visakhapatanam from 1982 to 1992. He opted for Tanzanian Mission in 1993. After a year of stay in MSFS Regional House at Morogoro, he was sent to India to pursue his Theological studies. After his priestly Ordination in 1997, he was appointed as the Bursar of SFS Junior Seminary, Morogoro, Tanzania. From 1999 to 2000, he was the Bursar of Fransalian Scholasticate, Morogoro. From 2001 to 2008, he served as the assistant parish priest of St. Joseph's parish Mlolongo, Kenya. From 2008 to 2011, he was the bursar of SFS School Katani, Kenya. From 2011 to 2012, he was the assistant parish priest of St. Francis de Sales' parish at Dumila, Tanzania. Towards the end of 2012, he was appointed at SFS Bhavan, Angamaly, India. In 2014, he was in Vinayabhavan Seminary, Thamarassery for six months for rest and treatment. Since 2015, he was

undergoing treatment and dialysis at Lissa Hospital, Thiruvampady, Kerala, India. He left for his heavenly abode on 08th January 2019 at 00.30 hrs.

Fr. Joseph Kunnapilly was a committed religious and missionary. He dedicated his life as a Brother and later as a priest for God and his people. He was always a joyful person even amidst the many challenges of his missionary endeavours. He was a man of extra-ordinary faith and trust in God. He suffered from diabetes almost for forty years, but his zeal for the mission never diminished. He was also an epitome of Salesian virtues such as optimism, gentleness, patience, humility, simplicity and hospitality. He loved nature. He planted hundreds of trees, wherever he was placed. The trees in the Provincial house, Junior Seminary, Kola, Mlolongo and Katani will tell of his love for nature. Above all, he had a deep sense of love and compassion for his fellow human beings.

His funeral took place on 11th January, 2019, at 14.30 hrs in SFS Seminary, Ettumanoor, Kerala, India. The Holy Eucharistic celebration and funeral services were presided over by Rt. Rev. Mathew Vaniakizhakkel V.C, Bishop emeritus of Satna (Madya Pradesh, India). Fr. Mathew Thazhathukunnel delivered the eulogy. Fr. Jose Parapilly preached during the Holy Mass appreciating the person of Fr. Joseph Kunnapilly. A large number of MSFS priests and non-MSFS priests (about 50) sisters, brothers, relatives and friends of Fr. Joseph came to pay their last respects to him.

I am indeed grateful to Fr. Benny Kootanal, the Provincial and the entire South West India Province for granting us permission to bury our Confrere at SFS Seminary, Ettumanoor. Our fathers at SFS Seminary under the leadership of Fr. George Chirayil tirelessly and meticulously organized everything for the funeral services. I would to extend my gratitude to Fr. Thomas Olickal and Fr. Jose Eriyanickal for taking care of Fr. Joseph Kunnapilly, when he was sick as well as for organizing the funeral services. We also are grateful to the family of Fr. Joseph Kunnapilly for looking after him for a number of years. I thank everyone who one way or other helped us to give a fitting farewell to our beloved confrere. I also thank everyone who came to participate in the funeral services or who sent condolences and prayed for the repose of the soul of Fr. Joseph Kunnapilly.

Fransalians in East Africa will miss a committed missionary in the person of Fr. Joseph Kunnapilly. We are grateful to God for having given us a loving friend, brother and a priest in the person of Fr. Joseph Kunnapilly. Let us continue to pray for the repose of our beloved confrere.

#### **KIKUNDE: OUR NEW MISSION IN MASAI KUSINI (ARUSHA)**

The cherished dream of long our Congregation to work in Maasai Kusini (South Masai) area of the Archdiocese of Arusha was fulfilled, when our Fathers Mathew Chavely and Martin Pendanath reached Kikunde mission in Masasi Kusini on February 01, 2019 accompanied by Fr. Thomas Kochuparampil and Fr. Jose Eriyanickal. Masai Kusini is a remote area in the Archdiocese of Arusha consisting predominantly of people of Masai tribe.



However, the mission entrusted to us in Masai Kusini is at Kikunde in the Tanga Region and consists of people from various tribes. Kikunde is part of Kijunge Parish, which has 3,000 Catholics spread over in five sub-stations. This area was pastorally neglected due to lack of priests and its remoteness. It is 500 kms. from Arusha, but is only 140 kms. from Morogoro. During rainy season the area is cut off due to flooding in the rivers. The area lacks proper roads, schools and medical facilities. Kikunde has a small parish church, but it lacks presbytery and parish office. Our Fathers are staying in a two-room temporary house. We require in Kikunde a presbytery, bore-well and installation of solar panels.

On February 02, Very Rev. Fr. Simon Tenges, the Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Arusha presided over the Holy Eucharistic celebration and officially entrusted Kikunde Mission to the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales. He thanked the Congregation for taking up the mission in Kikunde, which has a lot of potential for primary evangelization. Fr. Eustaki Tarimo, the Parish Priest of Kijunge introduced catechists, leaders of the parish and the office bearers of different pious associations and entrusted them to the new team. Rev. Fr. Thomas Kochuparampil, representing the Provincial thanked all the fathers, deacons, sisters, leaders and the faithful for the cordial reception, love and co-operation.



# Not Quite Ready for Lent?

# St. Francis de Sales Offers Perfect Assistance



So, it's Ash Wednesday, and Lent is come. You've read a dozen articles suggesting what you might do, or *not* do; what you might remove from your life for 40 days or what discipline you could add. You've pondered age-appropriate disciplines and how to get quiet. You've read so many suggestions and commentaries that you're beginning to panic. What if you do it wrong? What if your Lenten discipline isn't meaningful enough, or creative enough, or merciful enough?

Lent is here, but your head isn't — not really, not yet. You know that if you haven't come up with some social-media-approved scheme by which you might spiritually rebuild yourself top to bottom, you're just going to end up giving up chocolate, again, and feeling like you're beginning a season of penance with an inspiration-deficit.

Enter Saint Francis de Sales, who was in many ways rather like you and me, struggling to learn patience, wanting to vault the spiritual heights but consigned to the baby steps. This is a man who knows better than to grab at the high shelf before he has grown enough to reach it, or to settle for the low one out of laziness. And so he writes:

God takes pleasure to see you take your little steps; and like a good father who holds his child by the hand, he will accommodate his steps to yours and will be content to go no faster than you. Why do you worry?

Baby steps ...

You learn to speak by speaking, to study by studying, to run by running, to work by working; and just so, you learn to love by loving. All those who think to learn in any other way deceive themselves.

Don't panic if you don't have your Lenten season "all settled" today:

Never be hurried in anything. Do all things calmly and in a spirit of repose. Do not lose your inward peace, even if everything seems to be going wrong. What is anything in life compared to peace of soul?

First identify what is fundamental:

Examine your heart often to see if it is such toward your neighbour as you would like his to be toward you were you in his place. This is the touchstone of true reason.

And don't kid yourself. (Maybe the first rule of Lent is "don't kid yourself."

We all colour devotion according to our own likings and dispositions. One man sets great value on fasting, and believes himself to be leading a very devout life, so long as he fasts rigorously, although the while his heart is full of bitterness — and while he will not moisten his lips with wine, perhaps not even with water, in his great abstinence, he does not scruple to steep them in his neighbour's blood through slander and detraction.

All of these quotes are taken from *The Introduction to the Devout Life*, which — even if your Lent seems unpromising today — cannot help but change your thinking for the better over the course of these forty days. Consider reading it as something to "do" in anticipation of Easter.
