My dear confreres, Fraternal greetings to all of you!

Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows, the patroness of the MSFS is an eminent Fransalian Devotion handed down to us by our beloved founder. Devotion to our founder Fr. Peter Mermier is yet another hallmark of the Fransalians. We celebrate both these solemnities in September every year. By praying the obligatory novenas that precede the celebrations, let us prepare spiritually for these events!

I would like to highlight here two important qualities of our Founder which everyone of us may imitate:

a. Fr. Mermier used sermons and homilies as the main means of proclaiming the Word of God. He adopted carefully-prepared simple preaching. He spoke with faith and conviction using a fatherly tone of voice marked with a kindly understanding of sinners like St. Francis de Sales. Let us spend time to prepare our homilies and use it as a means to instruct people in the Word of God. **Let God speak through our homilies!**

b. Fr. Mermier was a zealous and hardworking missionary. This is particularly evident in his last years. He himself had conducted ninety missions between 1828 and 1857. This is an average of 3 mission preachings in a year. Even five years before his death, he had preached parish missions. In spite of his old age, he took over the Parish of Pougny as priest-in-charge on 26 June 1857. He fell seriously sick in Pougny and was taken to La Feuillette. His eye-sight and thinking capacity weakened. When he became a little better in July 1859, he took up a pilgrimage to Our Lady of La Salette, in France. He suffered a fierce attack on June 6, 1860 and became fully blind. On 10 August 1862 he had a fall, which caused a double fracture of his right leg. He left for his heavenly abode on 30 September 1862. Even in his last years, he never lagged behind in his zeal and hard work. Let zeal and hard work characterize our ministry!

Priestly Renewal Course in the Holy Land

Fr. Siljo Cherian and Fr. Abraham Musaja Kisegerwa attended the priestly Renewal Course in the Holy Land in July 2024. They had a safe journey and comfortable stay in Jerusalem and they profited a lot from the Course. Here below are their experiences:

My Journey to the Holy Land: An Experience of Grace and Reflection

My visit to the Holy Land was a pilgrimage of grace, reflection, and spiritual renewal. As I walked through the sacred sites (Bethlehem, Nazareth, Sea of Galilee, Mount of Olives, Via Dolorosa, Golgotha, Church of Holy Sepulchre, Dead Sea, Holy Temple, Western wall, and many other places) where Jesus lived, taught, and suffered, I felt a deep connection to the life of Christ—a connection that was far beyond what words could capture. The entire journey was like a living prayer. Throughout my time in the Holy Land, I felt a renewed passion for my faith. Each holy site I visited was a call to deeper prayer, reflection, and devotion. I left with a heart full of gratitude and a soul touched by the beauty of Christ's sacrifice. The journey reminded me of the boundless love of our Savior, a love that endures through time and transcends all human understanding.

I will always cherish this pilgrimage as a sacred encounter with the divine, an experience that deepened my connection to Christ and strengthened my commitment to follow Him more closely in my daily life. I express my sincere gratitude to our Provincial Superior, benefactors and the organizers for giving me this golden opportunity.

Ierushalom of Israel: A short description of my journey experience in Israel

The moment I stepped in Ierushalom – Israel, I felt the real presence of God. I saw Jesus Christ of history to be present, and, I felt much joy, peace, comfort and love in my heart. We went to the old Ierushalom and reached the western wall of the Temple mount. At this place, we had prayers with the Jews (something I have been dreaming of, but expecting to reach there one time by God's will).

We reached the following places: Temple Mount, Via Dolorosa, the streets of Ierushalom, the birth place of the B V Mary, the place where Mary visited Elizabeth, the birth place of John the Baptist, Mount of Olives, Bethany at the tomb of Lazarus, the place where Jesus stood and wept over Ierushalom, where Jesus ascended into heaven, River Jordan, Bet-lechem (birth place of Jesus Christ and the cave where the Angels found the shepherds and Gortto of milk), Nazareth, Mount Tabor (mt. of transfiguration), Iericho (on the Mount of temptation), Magdala (shore of Lake of Galilee), Korazim, Capharnaum, mount of the Beatitudes, house of Peter, Tabgha, Emmaus, Mount Sion (where Peter denied Jesus), the Cenacle, Jaffa (at the house of Simon the Tanner), Caesarea Malitima, and others. More interestingly, we visited Calvery and Sepulchre more than ten times of the time we spent in Ierushalom at Notre Dame.

We had seminar every day after super, and, we had retreats also. Our guide was well equipped with data about the places we visited. I enjoyed the journeys we made while visiting different historical sites. The Masses we celebrated every day (in shifts) in the Holy Land.

In brief I cannot explain everything because even today I feel that am in Israel. For sure, the historical Jesus cannot be separated from the Jesus of faith (Spiritual Jesus). Again, I walked on the Land of Jesus with my own legs, God is great and may His great name be praised always in my heart and life.

Lastly, I thank my Provincial Superior and his Council for giving me this opportunity to go to the Holy Land. Every day I used to pray for the Province of East Africa and the Congregation of msfs, and for the missions we have in the world. This journey has renewed my spiritual life.
